- 468 people implemented one or more best practices for improving soil quality /soil health
- **213** people implemented one or more best practices for soil /water conservation
- **319** people adjusted rate, timing, placement and/or sources to increase nutrient use efficiency
- The Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program reached **2,236** residents in Bullitt County.
- 100 % of the adult participants made a positive change in food group choices, food safety practices and food resource management.
- 67% made changes to be more physically active.
- KEHA members reported volunteer 150 hours for EXTENSION activities and events

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- **2,936** youth applied the skills learned in 4-H at home, school or in the community
- 873 youth made an impact in their community through service projects
- 323 youth indicated an increase in leadership skills, knowledge or confidence through participation in Extension-related leadership programs





- 8,270 parents and/or caregivers reported improved personal strengths, communication and life skills that strengthen families
- 5,690 individuals reported behaviors that fostered the optimal development of children and youth
- **5,623** parents/and or caregivers reported practicing parental leadership skills
- **2138** direct contacts with community members made by Master Gardener volunteers
- **1427** volunteer service hours completed by Extension Master Gardeners in the community
- **2367** people gained knowledge in consumer and home horticulture including: native plants, disease and pests, composting, site analysis, and proper maintenance
- 521 people who used Extension resources to identify plants or weeds



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
